Catholic Fact: Today the church celebrates the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul.

St. Paul was born at Tarsus, Cilicia, of Jewish parents who were descended from the tribe of Benjamin. He was a Roman citizen from birth. He completed his schooling in Jerusalem. He was educated in the strict observance of the ancestral Law, and also acquired a good knowledge of exegesis. He was trained in the practice of disputation. As a convinced and zealous Pharisee, he returned to Tarsus before the public life of Christ opened in Palestine. Some time after the death of Our Lord, St. Paul's profound Jewish convictions developed into a religious fanaticism against the infant Christian Church. He took part in the stoning of the first martyr, St. Stephen, and in the fierce persecution of the Christians that followed. Entrusted with a formal mission from the high priest, he departed for Damascus to arrest the Christians there and bring them bound to Jerusalem. As he was nearing Damascus, a light from heaven suddenly blazed round him, and Jesus with His glorified body appeared to him and addressed him. He fell from his horse, was blinded for weeks and eventually healed. During his blindness, an immediate transformation was wrought in the soul of St. Paul. He was suddenly converted to the Christian Faith. He was baptized, changed his name from Saul to Paul, and began traveling and preaching the Faith. His letters of instruction to the early church are relevant even in modern times. He was martyred as an Apostle in Rome around 65 AD. -excerpted from Lives of the Saints
